

LEARN and its Governance

- Lanka Education And Research Network (LEARN), the NREN (National Research and Education Network) of Sri Lanka was established in 1989.
- LEARN pioneered the setup of the first wide area network (WAN) in Sri Lanka, connecting universities and research institutions.
- As present, it is a Company Limited by Guarantee, owned by the UGC and State Universities.
- Membership



- The Operation of LEARN is Governed by the Articles of Association of LEARN (2009).
- Managed by the LEARN Board of Directors, one member each from the full member institutions.

LEARN: Vision and Mission



Vision

To be a world class Research and Education Network (REN) in the region, catering to the connection, communication and collaboration needs of the research and education community in Sri Lanka, to accelerate economic and social development.



Mission

- Equity for all: providing cutting-edge, highspeed, and accessible network infrastructure and services such that each individual stakeholder gets the best possible and fair opportunity to reach an equal outcome.
- More for less: address and anticipate the needs of the research and education community by offering sustainable, innovative and affordable infrastructure and services, removing the systemic barriers to provide equity for all.
- Reimagining Research and Education: providing maximum opportunity to all to connect, communicate and collaborate across the global Research and Education Networks, for continuous advancements in learning and innovation.


Internet Usage and Social Media in Sri Lanka

- As of June 2022, there were **19.43 million** (21%) mobile broadband subscriptions (3G and 4G) and about **3.08 million** (30%) fixed broadband subscriptions in Sri Lanka.
- The country recorded **11.34 million** internet users by January 2022 with an internet penetration rate of **52.6%**.
- 44.50% of the population (aged 5 to 69) used the internet at least once in 2021, with over 77.00% accessing the internet via smartphones.
- Social media users totaled around **8.20 million** by January 2022. The platforms with the most reach were Facebook (7.15 million), YouTube (6.68 million), Instagram (1.55 million), LinkedIn (1.50 million), and Twitter (296.7 thousand).
- TikTok's popularity has surged with over 900,000 users as of June 2021.

Internet Infrastructure, Ecommerce, and Digital Security in Sri Lanka

- Mean mobile internet connection speed in July 2022 was **20.99Mbps** (ranked 119 out of 140 globally), while mean fixed internet speed was **29.76Mbps** (ranked 129 out of 182).
- Ecommerce: **73.6%** of the population over 15 has a bank account, but only **7.7%** used online banking in 2021. In the same year, 2.7% made an online purchase, 4.7% paid bills online, and 47.2% used digital payments.
- The TRCSL (Telecommunications Regulatory Commission of Sri Lanka) is considering upgrading the local internet infrastructure by transitioning from 3G to 4G and 5G.
- Data privacy and security remain crucial. Despite passing the Data Protection Act, Sri Lanka still lags in prioritizing digital security at a national level. The effectiveness of this act is yet to be fully realized.


